Instead of spending the summer surfing the web, earn up \$10/hour while you learn how to build your own websites!

Student WEB CORPS Summer Youth Employment Program Overview:

- **8 week summer job experience focused on Web Development**
- **First day of Work: Monday, June 12, 2017**
- **Last day of Work: Friday, August 4, 2017**
- **Work Days/Hours: Monday – Friday, 8:30am – 1:30pm**
- **Pay: up to \$10.00/hour**
- **Student WEB CORPS Worksites: Whitehall-Yearling High School and Westland High School (location may change)**

This program is designed to strengthen your web development, project management and professionalism skills and to apply those skills in the authentic task of building websites for a mock business, organization or cause. Over the summer, you will learn the fundamentals of web development and also acquire skills that will help prepare you for future employment. Student-employees work 25 hours each week and earn an hourly salary. Eligible students apply to participate in the program and are assigned to one of the Student WEB CORPS worksites. Each cohort (up to 25 student-employees) is supported by two Worksite Supervisor-Instructors and a Site Coordinator.

THIS OPPORTUNITY IS ONLY OPEN TO STUDENTS WHO MEET ALL OF THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:

- Live and attend school in Franklin County
- Between the ages of 14-18 years old
- TANF-eligible (This program is for TANF-eligible students only, and you will need to prove eligibility to gain acceptance into the program.

Students MUST ATTEND 80% OF THE PROGRAM OR RISK REMOVAL. If you cannot commit to attending 80%, we recommend you DO NOT apply for the program this year.

Upon receipt of a student's interest form, parents/guardians will be contacted via phone to sign-up for a TANF Eligibility/Registration Session. During this session, families will prove TANF eligibility and complete required employment paperwork. The following documents provide proof of TANF-eligibility: CNPE printout from caseworker or community portal, benefit award letter or copy of OWF check from county or proof of income eligibility. All students must have a bank account setup before Registration Sessions and students under the age of 16 will need a Work Permit from their school district. INCOMPLETE PAPERWORK WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. STUDENTS WITHOUT ALL OF THE REQUIRED PAPERWORK RISK LOSING THEIR PRIORITY PLACEMENT IN THIS SUMMER WORK EXPERIENCE.

DISCLAIMER: Please note that students who successfully completed the Computing Career Corps program will have priority placement in Student WEB CORPS. Additional students will be added to the wait list and contacted to fill any open spots.
